Leila Sackfield, a member of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, a leadership society for women teachers, was recently honored as their California State Area X 2021 Distinguished Community Service Award Recipient. From coordinating and distributing Saturday Food events, providing over 3,900 boxes of food to members of the Escondido Community who became food insecure as a result of COVID, to the manufacturing of over 100 portable desks provided to support students in having an appropriate space to conduct school while in the virtual setting, Leila is hands on. As a former member of the Board of Directors of the San Diego Children's Discovery Museum, she continues to advise programming opportunities for the children of Escondido and is a long time and current member of the Escondido Charitable Foundation which provided rapid relief to

non profit organizations to respond to the many needs of those San Diegans impacted by the pandemic crisis. She also provided financial support to bring The Giving Arch to Escondido, which is a landmark sign that will welcome both residents and visitors to Escondido for years to come. She continues to contribute financially and act as a liaison between the Escondido Education Foundation and the Escondido Union School District.

She Served as a Moderator for California Ed Chat which is a weekly organized Twitter discussion of educators and people interested in education that meet virtually from all over the world and was a member of the Measure Q steering committee volunteering her time every night during the campaign in support of our local school bond Measure Q.

While doing all of this, Leila has been an active member of her church and its choir. A gifted musician, she frequently plays flute solos, and is also featured as a soloist, nowadays, in recorded presentations. If you've ever heard her sing, you know she has the voice of an angel.

Most importantly, Leila actually rescinded her retirement in the position of Deputy Superintendent of Human Resources in the Escondido Union School district to continue to assist the school district through this difficult time.

Pam Putnicki was recently recognized by Area X of the Delta Kappa Gamma Society International for being the Outstanding Member of her Delta lota Chapter. Originally from Texas where she taught Special Ed and First Grade for eight years, Pam is a long-time resident of Escondido. She was selected by the Kiwanis Club of Hidden Valley Escondido to receive their Distinguished Service Award before she retired from teaching at Rose School. Pam not only is on the Board of the Escondido Education Foundation, but is also a member of the Escondido Charitable Foundation. Additionally, she is an active member of her church, now serving on the vestry, and she and her husband have been ushers for many years and continue in that capacity at outdoor services, helping to ensure COVID 19 protocols.
